
During World War II, all military branches enlisted women in their ranks for the first time in history; nearly 350,000 American women served in uniform.




Ann E. Dunwoody became the first female battalion commander for the 82nd Airborne Division in 1992 and the first female general at Fort Bragg in 2000. In 2008, she became the first woman in the U.S. Armed Forces to be promoted to four-star general.




Midshipman First Class Sydney Barber is the first Black woman to serve as brigade commander at the U.S. Naval Academy. She holds the highest student leadership position at the academy.

# Portrait of DoD/Other 2022 Government Civilian Women

Margaret Chase Smith was the first woman in U.S. history to serve in both the House of Representatives (1940-1949) and the Senate (1949-1973). In 1964, she became the first woman to seek the presidential nomination of a major political party.



Carol Moseley-Braun was the first Black/African American woman to serve in the U.S. Senate and the first woman to represent the state of Illinois in the Senate; she served from 1993 to 1999. In 1999, she was appointed United States Ambassador to New Zealand.



On May 28, 2021, Christine Wormuth was appointed Secretary of the U.S. Army. Secretary Wormuth is the first woman to hold this position. She has also worked as the Under Secretary of Defense for Policy, the third-ranking civilian position at the Pentagon (2014-2016).


